Ghosts & Revenants, Memory, History, & Folklore

An exploration of the tradition of the ghost in literature as a harbinger, as a manifestation of guilt, conscience, memory, or the past; and as manifested in the folklore and history of the northeastern United States and Canada. This covers everything from Native American folklore and storytelling through “The Legend of Sleepy Hollow” to Straub's *Ghost Story* and Jackson's *The Haunting of Hill House*. We will explore the tradition and the uses of the ghost story, and how it continues in contemporary fantastic fiction and mutates in a 21st century environment. While we expect to have panels on such topics as “M.R. James and His Successors” and “The Legacy of Shirley Jackson” we might also have something as up-to-the-minute as “Ghosts in the Machine: The Supernatural and Computers.” If you have suggestions for program topics and/or ideas for who might discuss what, please write to us or send email to Program@firstduty.com.

Qualifications:

All books must have been published in 2006; magazines must have a 2006 cover date; only living authors and editors are eligible.

Fantasy Types: ALL FANTASY is eligible.

Categories: Life Achievement; Best Novel; Best Novella (10,001 to 40,000 words); Best Short Story; Best Anthology; Best Collection; Best Artist; Special Award--Pro; Special Award--Non-Pro. (Please note the nominees in the Life Achievement category will not be released. Only the winner's name will be announced at the awards banquet.)

Questions of eligibility, the judges, and the administration may be sent to the WFA Administrator.

George Scithers is a West Point graduate and electrical engineer whose first published fiction, "Faithful Messenger" appeared in *If* in 1969. However, his involvement in the field dates back to 1959 when he began publishing the two-time Hugo Award-winning fanzine, *Amra*. In 1973, he founded Owlswick Press, a small independent publishing company. In 1977, Scithers was named *Isaac Asimov's Science Fiction Magazine's* first editor, a position for which he won two more Hugo Awards in his five-year tenure. After leaving *IASFM*, Scithers took the editorial helm at *Amazing Stories* until 1986, then joined John Gregory Betancourt and Darrell Schweitzer to reestablish *Weird Tales*, where he continues as an editor.

Joseph Bruchac lives in the foothills of the Adirondacks in the same house where his maternal grandparents raised him. Much of his writing draws on that land and his Abenaki ancestry. With his wife, Carol, he is the founder and Co-Director of the Greenfield Review Literary Center and The Greenfield Review Press. His poems, articles, and stories have appeared in over 500 publications and he has written more than 70 books for adults and children. His honors include a Rockefeller Humanities fellowship, the Cherokee Nation Prose Award, the Knickerbocker Award, and the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Native Writers Circle of the Americas, which he received in 1999.

Our Artist Guest of Honor

Jean Giraud, born in 1938 in the suburbs of Paris, began his technical training at the Arts Appliqués at age 16. Two years later he was drawing his own comic strip. In North America Giraud is perhaps better known under his Moebius pseudonym, which Giraud came to use primarily for his science fiction and fantasy work.

The pseudonym was born in 1963 in satire magazine *Hara-Kiri* for which Moebius did 21 strips in 1963-64. In 1975 Moebius was resurrected for work in *Heavy Metal* (a magazine which he co-created). 1981 saw the debut of his famous *L'Incal* series in collaboration with Alejandro Jodorowsky. Moebius' serial *The Airtight Garage* and his groundbreaking "Arzach" also began in *Heavy Metal* (Métal Hurlant).

Moebius has contributed storyboards and concept designs to several science fiction films and has garnered recognition and numerous awards worldwide.

Our Special Guests

Barbara & Christopher Roden's long-time interest in the ghost story translated, in 1995, into the formation of Ash-Tree Press, which specializes in publishing supernatural fiction. In 1997 Ash-Tree Press received a World Fantasy Award, and in 2000 was honored with the special award of the Board of Trustees of the Horror Writers Association. Their involvement with the ghost story also extends to the day-to-day running of the Ghost Story Society, for which they edit the journal *All Hallows* (nominated for a World Fantasy Award in 2005, and International Horror Guild Award Winner for 2003).

They have edited, jointly and singly, several anthologies and collections. Of these, *Acquainted With The Night* was both a World Fantasy and International Horror Guild Award winner, and *Shadows and Silence* was both a World Fantasy and International Horror Guild nominee. In addition, Barbara's story "Northwest Passage" was nominated for the World Fantasy, Stoker, and International Horror Guild awards.

Christopher founded The Arthur Conan Doyle Society in 1989 and edits its journal, *ACD*; Barbara joined as co-editor in 1992. Both are Master Bootmakers (Canada's highest Sherlockian honour).

World Fantasy Awards Presentation & Banquet

The World Fantasy Awards for best work of 2006 will be presented Sunday afternoon. Luncheon will begin at 1:00pm (doors open at 12:30pm).

Saturday Evening Excursion: Saratoga Harness Track

We've arranged an optional side trip Saturday evening to the Saratoga Harness Track. The track will be running a 13-race card that evening and also has an electronic gaming center. Post time at the track is 7pm; the card usually ends around 10:30pm.

About Saratoga Springs

Saratoga Springs is one of New York's oldest resort communities. Originally people came for the baths and mineral water. Now, two seasons of horse racing and the ambience of a small town with much preserved from the nineteenth century are among Saratoga's highlights.

The area is steeped in history. A turning-point battle in the American Revolution was fought nearby, and battles, forts, trails from the French and Indian War and the American Revolution surround Saratoga. The cottage where

U.S. Grant wrote his memoirs and died is also nearby.

Museums celebrating racing, dance, and automobiles are found in Saratoga. Lyric Ballad Books, a world-class bookstore located in an old bank with its vault intact, is located blocks from the City Center. Many small shops and a wide variety of restaurants are within easy walking distance along Main Street.

Saratoga is home to the famed Yaddo Artist colony whose grounds are open for tours. Skidmore College is located just north of the City Center and New York State's Empire College is also located in Saratoga.

Getting There

Air: Saratoga Springs is served by Albany International Airport (locator code ALB); the town is about 26 miles from the airport. The airport has direct service by many major U.S. airlines, and is an International Port of Entry. Almost everyone attending WFC 2007 will be able to book a direct or one-connection flight for arrival and departure.

Rail: Amtrak's Saratoga Springs station is a long walk or a short taxi ride from the primary hotel. Amtrak has two trains daily from New York City, Boston, and Montreal; and one train daily from Chicago and Toronto (connecting through Albany).

There will be a free shuttle meeting each Amtrak train in Saratoga, Thursday through Sunday.

Auto: Saratoga Springs is located about 35 miles north of Albany, New York, about equidistant from Montreal, Boston, and New York City.
